



Fig:- Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose Birth Day






Fig:- 26th January Republic Day

NOTE: 1. CREDIT CARD, LIGHT REFRESHMENT CHARGE, JEC CHARGE, DONOR CERTIFICATE & ORGANISER CERTIFICATE WILL BE APPLIED ON SPOT IF AVAILABLE ON THAT TIME.

2. Blood may be collected in 350 ml (single, double, triple, quadruple BB) for donor wt 45kg or more and 450 ml (double, triple, quadruple BB) for donor wt 55kg or more according to current stock position of Blood Bags, Blood Units at Blood Centre on that time.

3. No microphone to be used during the blood donation camp.
4. You may contact Medical Officer, blood centre of this hospital personally to know the other norms of holding blood donation camp or if any point is not clear to you.
5. A separate place with sufficient light and fans has to be provided for check up / selection of donors so that confidentiality can be assured. This is mandatory.
6. The camp site must be easily accessible for blood centre vehicle (Mini-bus type).





Fig: - World AIDS Day
